Open Space

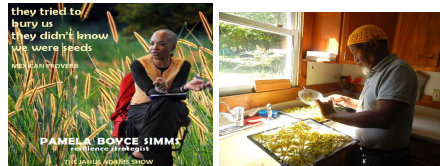

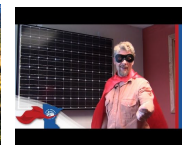
