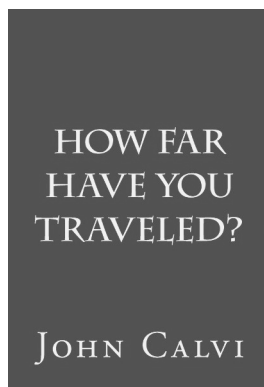

Enjoy presentations by your favorite Quaker authors and Spirit-led advocates.

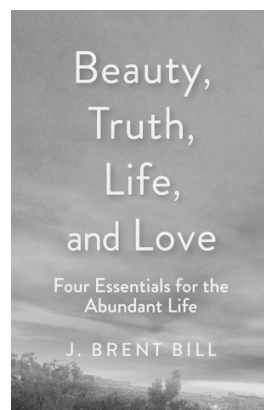
Monday, July 1st, 2019

1:30pm - 3:00pm in JRC: 225

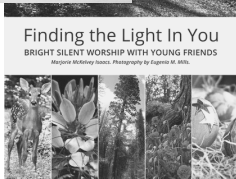

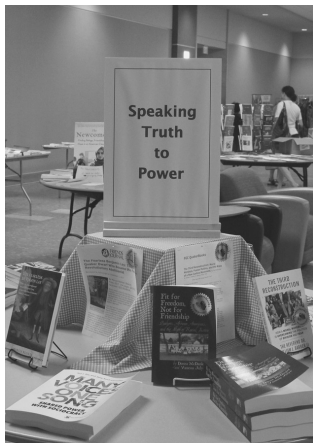
The camera lens and the author's words bring into sharp focus the humanity of individuals caught in addiction. Troubling and compelling, these portraits will not leave our hearts untouched.
